

## Best Editing Tips-Proofreading

- Spelling
- Have I spelled all the words correctly?

Keep a list of problem words and use the list as part of your checklist



## Proofreading

- Have I written complete sentences?
- Have I used the correct verb forms?
- Do subject and verbs agree?

# **Optimal Proofreading**


- Proofread aloud.
- Check for complete sentences, end punctuation, and commas.

#### **Proofreading Tip**

 As you read, mark places where you have questions, finish reading



### **Proofreading Tip**

- Use a computer spell checker
- Do not rely on it alone
  - It will not catch all errors
